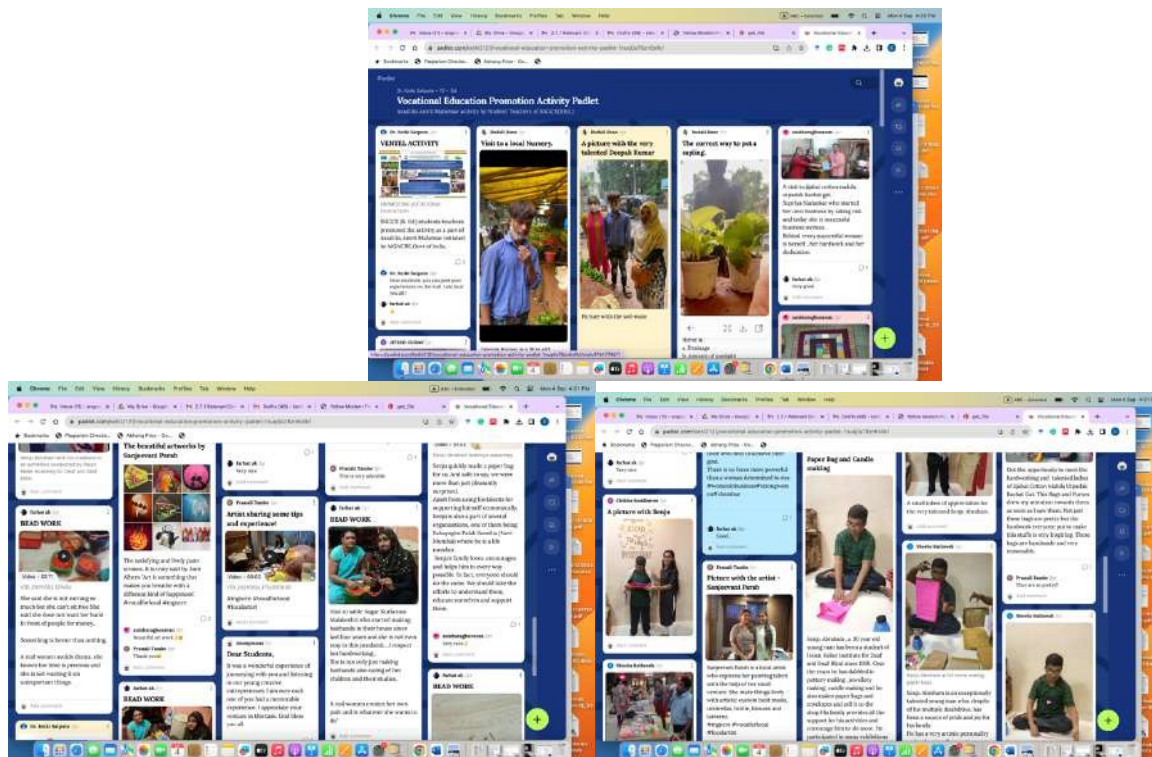
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## **Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav September 2021**

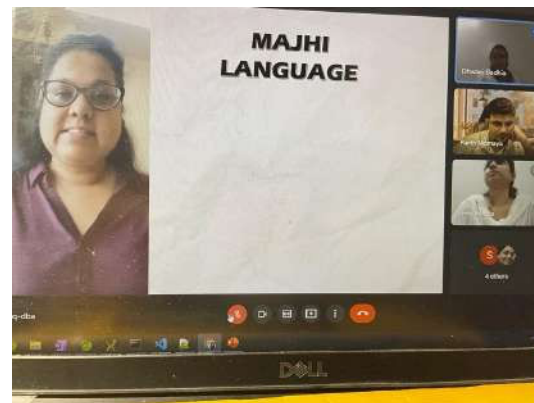
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## **International Language Day 13<sup>th</sup> April 2022**

- A Doctor cannot decide whether you were sexually assaulted or not with a verbal statement
- You can file your FIR through Email
- There is no any time limit for filing FIR
- A full written statement is always required

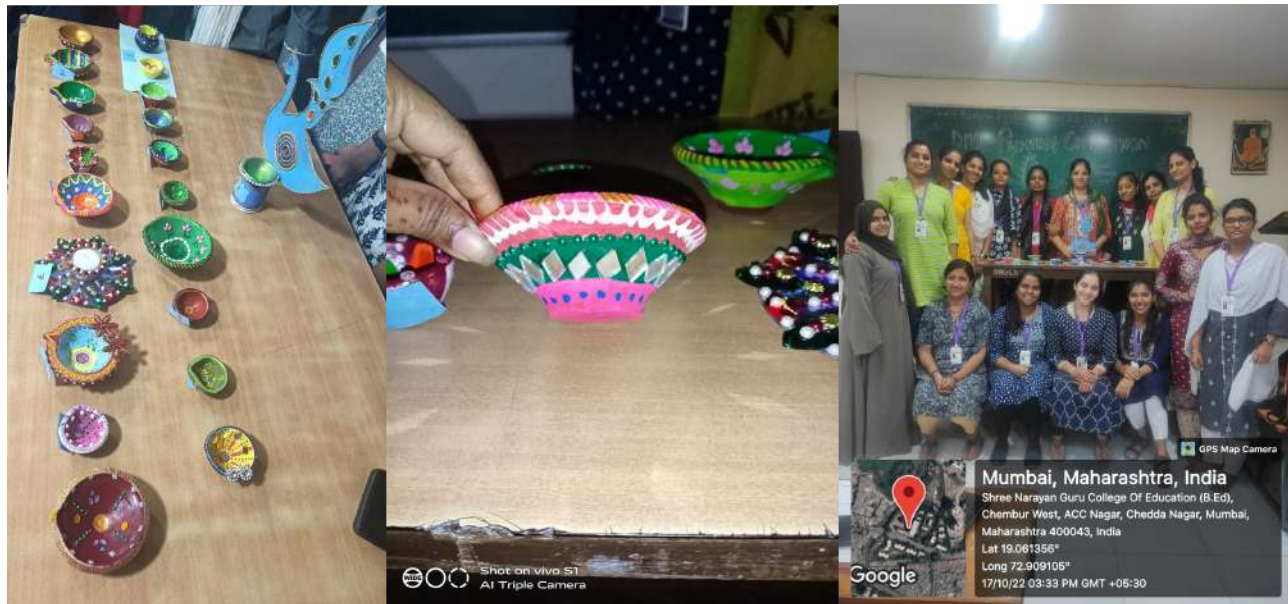


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## **Diya Painting Competition 17<sup>th</sup> October 2022**
